From the Priest in Charge Fr. Jere Hinson

To the saints, the faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Northeast Kansas and Northwest Missouri: Grace and peace to you from God our Father! How wonderful it has been to continue our celebration of our risen Lord as we move from Easter towards Pentecost. As much as I love Easter, I think Pentecost is likely my favorite feast of the church year. For one thing the liturgical color is red which is my favorite color (and the primary color of my favorite baseball team—note that Pentecost always falls in baseball season!). But more importantly the Second Chapter of Acts, which is read on Pentecost, represents much of my thinking about what it means to be Church, to be the Body of Christ, and, most particularly, to be the Episcopal Branch of the Jesus Movement here in this place and time.

In the Creed we utter every Sunday we note that the Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. The Spirit is thus characterized by movement (and oh how we Episcopalians like processions!). We see that especially at Pentecost when the coming of the Spirit moves the disciples, catches them up, and propels them into new adventures in ministry. They are emboldened and encouraged. They are exceedingly generous. They are given the ability to communicate the inner meaning of the Gospel to people at their point of need so they can understand it. There are signs and wonders showing the profound truth that behind the creation of the cosmos is love. And God adds to their number daily. Wow!

Highlighting the movement of the Spirit this May at St. Paul's you'll see a number of happenings focused on transitions. First Wednesday, 1 May, will feature Chad Senuta and the Reverend Karen Schlabach from the diocese to talk with us about youth and young adult ministry. Sunday, 5 May, 5pm, high schooler and young adults are invited to the parish hall for a conversation with me about what we might create here at St. Paul's for them to grow. 5 May our worship will feature an instructed eucharist with the sermon focused on better understanding our corporate way of prayer. Our baptism and inquirer's class on Mondays continues, culminating in Christian Skaggs baptism on Pentecost Sunday, 19 May. I've been particularly moved by some of you partnering to accompany him on his faith journey. Thank you!

But that's not all! 12 May features not only Mother's Day, but also a day to recognize our graduates. 19 May we will also recognize parishioners who are completing their careers and entering new callings in the world of retirement. 19 May will also feature our vestry meeting at which I've asked Mark our organist and choir director to present a brief on organ refreshment so that we can not only better understand the costs to maintain our historic instrument, but also better understand the transformation of life that is enhanced by the music of our Sunday worship: the way we worship IS life changing!

Flipping forward one more month we will celebrate the Hood family as they change duty stations and head on to their next assignment. In June we'll also celebrate the ministry of our teachers and likely a rummage sale. More to follow. Peeking forward even further, in July we're even planning a VBS—see Jennifer Turner to find out more!

I continue to marvel at the way the Spirit is blowing through our common life here in Leavenworth. Together we trim the sails and give just a touch of rudder as God gives us course and speed into a bountiful future. I am so thankful to be with you on this voyage!

From the Sr. Warden

This month your Vestry decided to purchase two Zoll automated external defibrillator (AED) machines. One will replace the AED in the Parish House and the other will be for the Church itself. They will be purchased from the Church's Memorial Fund and you are welcome to donate funds to the Memorial Fund to help offset the cost. Lisa Masterson and Kathy Meyer did great work identifying these machines and coordinating with the American Red Cross for their purchase. The Vestry is also exploring the option of replacing the Parish House tables and chairs. Candy Dials is leading this effort and has identified candidate round tables and stacking metal chairs for purchase. She determined the Parish House will need fifteen tables, each with eight chairs apiece. The cost of a table and eight chairs is approximately \$1425 but the remaining renovation funds can only pay for five table and chair sets. The Vestry will discuss funding options during the May Vestry meeting and will identify opportunities for parishioners to help defray the cost. In June we will discuss <u>The Heaven and Earth Grocery Store</u> and also select readings for the next few months.



OUTREACH COMMITTEE NEWS

Our Outreach Project for March 2024 was Leavenworth Interfaith Community of Hope. It has been assisting those who live in poverty in Leavenworth since December, 2014. It began first as Welcome Central, then they added an emergency night shelter. In 2016 they added a day shelter and combined all three services in their own building. Their community could not exist without folks who offer financial support and those who share their time – over 100 volunteers each week keep them running 365 days (and nights) a year. Thank you to all that contributed. In March you gave this organization \$633.00.

On Sunday, April 7th, Fr Jere blessed the offering envelopes in which the congregation of St Paul's gave their Lenten offerings to Leavenworth Affordable Housing. All totaled we raised \$2024.64 and reached the level of "Platinum Sponsor." Many thanks to Joy Kromer who spearheaded the wonderful opportunity to help create systemic change for those on the verge of homelessness.

Through the gifts of talent and labor from Joe and Michelle Garcia and with the help of the youth of St Paul's, our church will be able have a small community lending library in the yard of our Parish House.

Our Outreach Offering for May will once again be in support of the Community Meal. We will be collecting for this three times in 2024. St Paul's members, along with volunteers from The Protestant Main Post Chapel, Ft Leavenworth, have provided meals for anyone in the community needing nourishment and fellowship. Our

meals have been take out in





2023, and we look forward to having meals served in our Parish House in 2024. Your generous support, through three designated monthly offerings, makes it possible to provide delicious healthy meals.



During May an additional outreach opportunity will be



taking place to support the Foster Closet. The people of St Paul's, family and friends will have a chance to help with this by donating gently used, clean clothing for children for ages newborn to eighteen years. These donations can be dropped off

in the church narthex during the month of May. After each service these items will be put away until the first Saturday in June when the youth of our church will deliver them to the Foster Closet.


