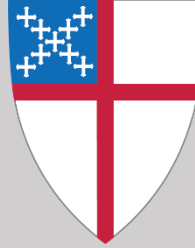

From the Priest in Charge

Fr. Jere Hinson

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! To all who are in Northeast Kansas and Northwest Missouri who are loved by God and called to be his holy people: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ (Romans 1:7). What a glorious Lent, Holy Week and Easter we celebrated! Take a look at the pictures and see the signs and wonders of enduring worship, gracious welcome and generous community on display. A huge THANK YOU to all of you who helped to make this possible. A special shout out to Mark our organist and to the choir for leading our voices in praise; to the Altar Guild for their creative and holy striving to have our space ready for worship; to Michelle our digital minister for the donation of equipment and skill to help us extend our embrace to those in virtual spaces; to Bruce who spent the whole night in vigil to ensure the safety of those who kept watch. The list goes on and on...thank you, thank you, thank you!

We welcomed Teddy Hood into the family of God and were delighted to host the Hood's extended family. One of my favorite things to do as a priest is to prepare people for baptism and Teddy's is but the first this year. In April at 5pm on Mondays in the Parish Hall I'll be hosting an inquirers class aimed particularly at young adults who are seeking baptism or confirmation. We won't have the bishop until next year, so I will run another confirmation/reception class in the Fall. This class, which will meet only in April and May will help at least one young adult prepare for baptism on Pentecost. Pray about it and see if you're called to come along for the journey. Companions are always welcome!

April will also feature many other opportunities to deepen and broaden your faith. We have the usual suspects of Sunday School, First Wednesday, Friends in Service to St. Paul's, Steadfast Stitchers, Community Meal, Grandparents at Prayer, Men's Fellowship at the Depot, Men's Prayer Breakfast, Choir, and Happy Bookers. Thanks to the leadership of Lisa Masterson, we'll have a CPR/AED training on 27 April. There is also a Junior High Retreat our younger people can participate in through our partnership with the diocese, as well as summer camp sign ups. I love the variety of offerings we have for people of all ages to come together and grow in wisdom and stature and favor with God and humanity (Luke 2:52).

Finally, 19-21 April I will be away at what we used to call 'mandatory fun' in the military: The Diocesan Clergy retreat being held at the Diocese of Oklahoma's camp in Wewoka, OK. I'm looking forward to this as time with our bishop, who I admire greatly, is precious. Deacon Allen will lead services and preach that Sunday. I'm so glad to have him as part of the team so please make sure to support his ministry by your presence!

In closing, please pray with me one of my favorite prayers from our prayer book (page 290):

O God, you have created all things by the power of your Word, and you renew the earth by your Spirit: Give now the water of life to those who thirst for you, that they may bring forth abundant fruit in your glorious kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The April Outreach Project will support the Leavenworth Council on Aging, (Meals on Wheels). The Meals on Wheels program delivers a nutritionally-balanced, hot meal to homebound individuals throughout Leavenworth County. This program ensures family

members that their loved ones will have a healthy, nutritious meals delivered to their homes, five days per week. The program also provides an opportunity for daily contact with one of our staff members or a Meals on Wheels volunteer.



Seniors who are over the age of 60, have difficulty preparing meals or have no one available to prepare a noon-day meals, and are homebound are eligible for the program.

When: April 27-28, 2024 (youth and adult staff arrive April 26)

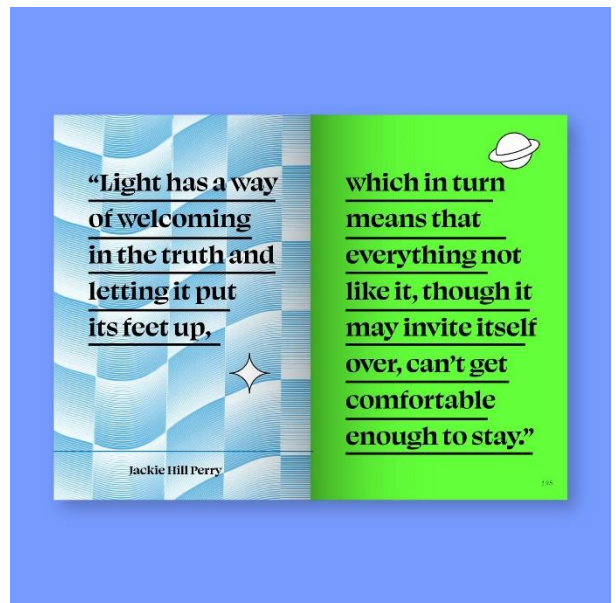

From the Sr. Warden:

This month the Vestry focused on many different things. First, we began investigating the requirements (and restrictions) associated with obtaining a historical preservation grant. Next, we asked Lisa Masterson, to help identify the requirements and cost to purchase an additional Automated External Defibrillator (AED) for the Church. Next, we received the results of a Church Insurance inspection and began work to video the Church's possessions in case they have to be replaced. Then, we agreed to transition the Church's bookkeeping software to a cloud-based solution that is more secure and meets the diocese's stringent Personally Identifiable Identification (PII) requirements. And finally, we asked Candy Dials to generate a cost estimate to replace the tables, chairs, and silverware in the Parish House. Many thanks to those who volunteered to assist with these, and other tasks for the benefit of the Parish. Palm Sunday



The Passion According to Mark

The congregation reciting verses from the Passion Gospel is read in parts led by a narrator who begins by saying: **The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to the Gospel of Mark.**

NARRATOR: It was two days before the Passover and the festival of Unleavened Bread. The chief priests and the scribes were looking for a way to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him, for they said,

CHIEF PRIESTS: "Not during the festival, or there may be a riot among the people."

NARRATOR: While he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at the table, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment of nard, and she broke open the jar and poured the ointment on his head. But some were there who said to one another in anger,

DISCIPLES: "Why was the ointment wasted in this way? For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii, and the money given to the poor."

NARRATOR: And they scolded her. But Jesus said,

JESUS: "Let her alone, why do you trouble her? She has performed a good service for me. For you always have the poor with you, and you can show kindness to them whenever you wish, but you will not always have me. She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for its burial. Truly I tell you, wherever the good news is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in remembrance of her."

NARRATOR: Then Judas Iscariot, who was one of the twelve, went to the chief priests in order to betray him to them. When they heard it, they were greatly pleased, and promised to give him money. So he began to look for an opportunity to betray him.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples said to him,

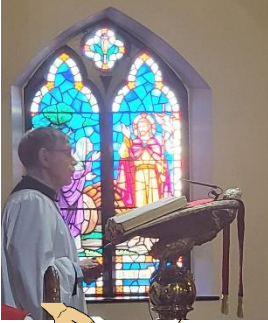
DISCIPLES: "Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?"

NARRATOR: So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them,

JESUS: "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, 'The Teacher asks, Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there."
